Hi two questions please: 1. Please can the following opportunity be offered to people living in St DAvids on the allotment waiting list: Exeter Community Centre on St David's Hill which has a large formal garden behind the main building. Alongside the garden in a separate gated area we have four raised (waist height) beds approx 150cm x 90cm which were used by St David's school until recently, but unfortunately they are no longer able to manage them. We wondered if there is currently anyone waiting for an allotment who preferably lives in or around St David's who would be interested in using them? The area has a water supply and a bin for green waste, and could be accessed at any reasonable time by a gate code, so any interested person(s) would have to be trustworthy and also fairly quiet as the area is overlooked by windows where classes/meetings are often held. 2. Please can you tell me how many allotments there are and how long the waiting list is? Is it a general list for the whole of the city or do people say where they'd prefer?
